SPARC Field Day 2008, Bay Pines Florida by Dave KR4U

I would like to dedicate our field day effort this year to the memory of John Stark, KU4BT. He was a valued member of our club, served on our VE team for many years, and was also a dedicated member of the SPARC contest group participating in as many events as his work schedule would allow. John will be sadly missed by all.

First off I want to thank all of our members who helped me pull this event together and all the folks who came out to our site to operate. We sure had some excellent support! As Leslie mentioned earlier, we had some non-members who came out to assist us in the setup and teardown of our antennas...thank you all.

Our luck held up again this year (we must be doing something right) as far as the weather was concerned. There were a few rumblings late Saturday afternoon but that was it...NO RAIN! We operated as 5A again with 2 SSB and 2 CW stations on 24 hours and 1 10 meter utility station for SSB and PSK31. We used the same antenna setup as last year with one addition. One SSB and the 10 meter station used verticals, the other SSB station used a multiband inverted V. The CW stations used verticals and a 15 meter half-square constructed by Tom, W4CU. Prior to field day, Tom had set this antenna up at home and had it tuned very well. Its performance was outstanding when 15 meters was open and many solid QSO's were logged. Speaking of logging we setup 5 laptop computers using our "Writelog Software". This was done prior to field day to make sure all would run smoothly, each computer was assigned to a station dependent on the bands being used. All power used for the stations and computers was provided by generators and deep cycle marine batteries. Our equipment worked perfectly for the entire 24 hours and goes to show what results from good preparation ahead of time.

On the VHF side we were fortunate again this year to have Paul, KC4YDY and his 2 and 6 meter stand alone station in operation. He did an excellent job and had some good six meter openings. 84 contacts were logged on six meters.

I had the pleasure of turning my key over to Dan Street, K1TO the President of "The Florida Contest Group" and his friend Gus Samuelson, VO1MP visiting from Canada. They each made numerous contacts on 20 CW using the Ten-Tec Jupiter. I think they really enjoyed themselves at our field day.

A milestone was met Saturday night when Pete, WB2SUN made his first CW contact during a SPARC field day event. He used his own set of keyer paddles and I had the pleasure of logging his contact into Writelog to add to our total. We all very proud of his accomplishment and hope that he will continue his pursuit of CW excellence. GREAT JOB Pete!

Well that's about it for my report on field day 2008. I hope everyone had as much enjoyment as I had and looking forward to the next one. Again thanks to everyone involved...it was GREAT!





2008 W4TA Field Day Wrap by Ron Hall KP2N

The annual SPARC ARRL Field Day exercise turned out to be our best effort to date. With the 2007 effort still clearly in our minds several ideas were formulated and put into action by a large percentage of the membership.

Bob, N2ESP, took over the task of leading the SSB effort. The end result was a marked increase in the number of contacts. Our VHF guru Paul, KC4YDY, got off to a slow start due to the location of his 6M antenna. Moving the antenna away from the 75/20M dipole did the trick. The end result was 20 more contacts than last year.

Leslie, WA4EEZ, rounded up 4 PSK31 contacts on 10M. When her and Alan, KO4CR, tried 10M SSB they were not getting good results. With the help of Kenny, K4OB, and Pete, KB9LXM, it was discovered that the hand microphone on Leslie's Icom 706 was defective. Pete pulled the microphone from his 706 and low and behold 10M contacts started to roll in.

Down on the CW site we had the welcome addition of Scotty, N4RI, and Tom, W4CU. Tom furnished a 15M half square antenna that really did the job. W4TA was loud in 6 and 7 land. The 40M vertical was improved with the addition of more radials. One could set on a frequency all night and run stations.

Dave, KR4U, did a super effort on 20M and 80M early Sunday morning. Vertical antennas over salt water equal good signals. Also helping out pounding brass was Kenny, K4OB, Pete, WB2SUN, and Bob, N1XX, and special guests

Gus, VO1HP, and Dan, K1TO. Dan is president of the Florida Contest Group and brought Gus over from Madeira Beach. Each took their turn on 20M and entered many contacts to the log. For educational purposes Tom gave a demo of how to tie Field Day knots. Roger, K4SHI, loaned us his Honda generator that used only 3 gallons of gas for 24 hours. Both CW stations ran on deep cycle batteries.


