2007 Florida QSO Party by Bob, N2ESP

Going for the three-peat, operators from the St. Petersburg Amateur Radio Society (SPARC) competed in the Florida QSO party in the Multi-operator, single transmitter category on April 27 & 28. Running both CW and SSB stations, the team racked up an impressive claimed score of 278,512 points, consisting of 103 multipliers and 836 contacts, in spite of poor propagation and a horrendous noise level.

The game plan was to alternate between CW and SSB modes. The CW station consisted of the Yaesu FT-920, while the SSB station utilized the Kenwood TS-450S. Both stations took advantage of the log periodic beam antenna and utilized write log contesting software.

Using the phonetics **W4 Gators Are Champs** to attract contacts, a special satisfaction was felt when Ohio stations were logged. In addition to Ohio, contacts were made with many other states. We made contact with numerous Canadian stations; Ontario seemed to have a pipeline directly to St Pete. Included in our Canadian contacts was a QSO with snowbird and club member Don, VE3XD. Some of the DX stations in the log were located in Costa Rica, Germany, and several other countries.

SPARC 220 REPEATER ANTENNA REPAIRED


With the able assistance of Richard, KG4MRH, a new Hustler G7-220 antenna was installed for the WA4AKH SPARC 220 MHz repeater.

The original antenna, also an Hustler G7-220, was destroyed by lightning. It was noted that the VSWR was running about 25% reflected power. Richard returned again to the antenna site and made an adjustment to the lower section's overall length. VSWR is now zero reading and reports in the field indicate the antenna is working better than ever. If you have a 220 radio please check into the SPARC 220 net every Thursday at 7:30 PM on 224.660 - no PL.
