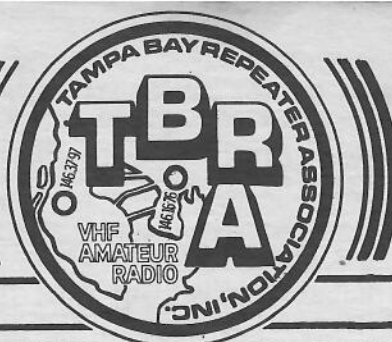
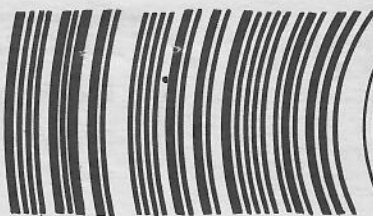

tbra MINUTES

On February 14, 1978 the TBRA meeting was called to order at 7:40 p.m.

President Bob Shireling, WB4GDF, welcomed visitors, following which members and visitors introduced themselves.

The minutes of the January meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report showed a balance of \$1,272.51. Ed also announced that he has forms for amateur call plates and application forms for membership.

Public Service Director Jim Daniels, WB4OMY, reported that 35 people were actively involved in providing service during Gasparilla Day and thanked everybody for helping.

The President thanked Jim and all members for their efforts during Gasparilla and requested a list of all people who participated in all of the events.

K4MDY made presentations for public service events to WA4LEN, WB4OMY, WA4VMH and WB4GDF.

Publicity Director Bob Haynes, WB4AKA, reported on Gasparilla news releases.

The President requested that anyone who is taking part in any public service events try to get color slides showing our activities, because we would like to make a new presentation of TBRA.

OLD BUSINESS

John Allen, K8GHE, presented a certificate of appreciation for public service activities of Butch Howard, WB4EKP.

NEW BUSINESS

The President suggested a VHF Field Day in the Bay Area shopping centers to inform the public what we are doing and what TBRA is all about. He stated that he would like to see a committee that would begin arrangements and planning for Field Day and asked for volunteers. WB4AKA, WB4KLW, WA4THT and WB4EKP volunteered. WB4AKA volunteered to serve as Chairman.

The President proposed that once a month we select a restaurant at which to meet and have brunch or breakfast. WB4AKA suggested that we meet for dinner prior to regular meetings. WB4EKP suggested short excursions by car to locations for outdoor activities. It was agreed that members would listen for announcements on these activities on the Thursday night nets.

The President requested volunteers to serve on an entertainment committee.

The President requested a new net control station to relieve Ed Paremske, WB4FGQ, for the Thursday night net.

Wally, N4BZ, presented a suggestion that TBRA members compile recipes for the printing of a cookbook to be sold to the public to raise funds for TBRA for the printing of QSP.

The President announced that there is one more opening in the organization for business manager to help Wally with the printing of QSP and requested that anyone who was interested should talk to Wally.

WB4BQZ, of the Tampa Amateur Radio Club announced to members that from March 29 through April 9 at the Florida State Fair TARC will need assistance in operating its booth. He said TARC will run a six-meter radio teletyp from the booth to its clubhouse and put the messages out on high-frequency teletype. He said it would offer a chance for those interested to get initiated in teletype and asked for volunteers to contact TARC.

Dave, WB6GBT, offered continuing Novice Classes every Tuesday night at his home and stated he is trying to put together a class for those wishing to obtain a General Class License.

There being no further new business the meeting was adjourned at 2015, followed by refreshments and an illuminating, enlightening talk by Ed Tilton, W1HDQ, on the observation and effect of sunspots.

BOARD meeting

The Executive Board was called to order at 6:30 p.m., on February 14, 1978, with seven members present.

Bernie Glassen, WA4KLW, was elected as President.

It was agreed that the Board continue to meet at 6:30 p.m. on regular TBRA meeting nights, at the same location.

There was a discussion as to operating practices of certain members of TBRA.

There was a discussion of the two control lines for the repeater and the fact that only one is necessary and the desirability of getting one removed.

The association is down to twelve copies of the "Welcome" article put into QSP. It was suggested that WB4GDF rewrite "Welcome" and that 500 copies be run for QSP and enough for one year's supply for new members.

K4KNX showed samples of cookbooks that can be compiled by amateurs and sold to help gain funds for printing QSP. Recipes would be solicited from association members. Each book would sell for approximately \$2.95, for a profit of \$1.25 to \$1.50 per book.

K4WSB requested a change in the second paragraph of the operating procedures of TBRA, and a discussion followed.

WB4GDF entertained a motion to have the cookbook printed. Motion passed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m.

F C C RESOLVES DILEMMA

The Federal Communications Commission is presently making sweeping changes in amateur rules and regulations designed to relieve the administrative load at the Commission office. In general this has been and should be met with enthusiasm by the amateur fraternity. In part it is a reward for the self-control exhibited by amateurs over the years. However, there is no such animal as a change that does not anger someone.

One such change was Docket 21033 which eliminated special repeater and auxiliary station licenses and among other things added a new repeater subband from 144.5-145.5 Mhz. In response to a petition from the ARRL that docket was stayed. This produced a dilemma because with that docket the FCC no longer processed applications for repeater licenses. Because the docket was not released repeater licenses were necessary before new repeater or auxiliary stations could begin thus there was no way new repeaters could be put on the air.

Effective February 14, 1978 the Commission has temporarily waived the appropriate sections to make it possible for amateurs to operate their primary stations as repeaters or auxiliary stations without notifying the FCC. While operating they must identify using their own call sign followed by the letters RPT or AUX on CW or the words REPEATER or AUXILIARY as appropriate. This waiver will remain in effect until it is superseded by the final Docket 21033.

Docket 21135 originally would have eliminated all but primary stations which meant military recreation stations, club stations, secondary stations, special event stations, and RACES stations. Well they have, with considerable help from about 400 individuals and groups, reconsidered. The purpose of this Docket is to reduce the workload on the Commission staff and of course one could wonder how, considering the enormity of CB in the same division, how any change in amateur licensing methods could have a measurable impact. Still, if it really does reduce the bureaucratic workload we certainly shall lend a sympathetic ear. These are the rule changes that will go into effect on March 24, 1978.

1. There will be no more secondary or special event licenses.

Existing secondary station licenses may be held until their expiration date but will not be renewed. If you have a secondary station license and you wish to KEEP THE CALL SIGN - you may have your primary station license modified to that call sign. THIS IS TRUE EVEN IF IT IS FOR A DIFFERENT CALL AREA.

2. Call SIGN Simplification

There will be no special call signs issued. All call signs will be issued systematically beginning with the suffix AAA to ZZZ. 1x2 and 2x2 call signs will be from AA to ZZ and 2x1 signs will be from A-Z.

There will be no guarantee of a retention of format when moving from one call area to the next. In other words if I moved back to Mass. I would not be guaranteed a 1x2 call, however, I would be allowed to keep N4BZ even with a Massachusetts address.

All Pacific Area amateurs outside the Continental U.S. will be assigned call signs beginning with KH followed by a number designating the island or group of islands where the station is located. All Atlantic Area stations will receive similar calls beginning with KP.

In addition they hope in the future to provide an opportunity for Advanced, General and Technician Class Amateurs to obtain upon request, a non-specific 1x3 call sign.

This new Docket keeps repeater auxiliary, (waived by the previous mentioned action and probably to be scrapped later) control, club, military recreational, and RACES stations.



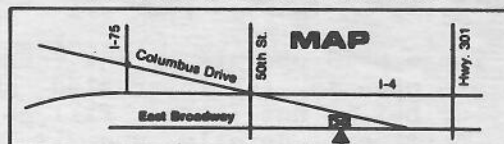

There is a move afoot to reward those members of our organization who devote a considerable amount of time on Public Service projects. I think that is grossly unfair to all of those who go out of their way every day of the week to give our repeater the kind of personality we all know and love.

Therefore I am proposing a new kind of award. In fact a group of awards that will enable us to justly reward those members who try so hard to make a lasting impression on all who listen to our repeater.

THE BUCKET MOUTH AWARD

An applicant for the Bucket Mouth Award must be able to break into any conversation regardless of subject matter and spend a minimum of 15 minutes telling any one individual, to the exclusion of all others, all about himself, his new radio his new amplifier, and the radio he is going to swap tomorrow.

THE SAINT BERNARD DOG AWARD

An applicant for the Saint Bernard Dog Award must remind us at least once every 15 minutes for a solid week that he is listening to the repeater.

THE ORDER OF THE PURPLE OPEN WIRE KILOWAT

The Order of the POWK is open to any 2 KW DC Bander who thinks two meters is an extension of his private frequencies. He must prove himself by not acknowledging breaking stations, turning group discussions into personal two-ways, and in general ignoring amateurs he hasn't known for twenty years.

THE W.T. GRANT AWARD

To be eligible for the W.T. Grant Award member must interrupt every conversation on the repeater for two weeks using a walki-talki without ever getting a single intelligible sentence across.

I am sure we could appoint an awards committee that could elaborate on these.. The point is why should awards be given only to those who contribute to public service or the betterment of amateur radio or other shop-worn phrases. As you can see we have more deserving recipients if you only use a little imagination.

On the other hand, maybe no one quite qualifies for any of these awards maybe it's just that each of us is a little bit guilty of all of these offenses and if we thought about it a moment, together we could make our repeater a pleasure to listen to.....
