



OFFICIAL BULLETIN FROM ARRL: The comment deadline in Docket 19658, The FCC proposal for a new fees schedule, has been extended a month. for amateurs, the basic fee would be six dollars for a five year license, as opposed to nine dollars at present and ten dollars in the 1972 proposal which has never become effective. Modifications without renewal are proposed at five dollars, against four now and five in the 1972 list, Special call sign fees would remain at twenty five dollars. Novice licenses, RACES authorizations and military recreation stations would continue to be free of charge. The new comment deadline is October 21, reply comments by November 4. The procedural requirement of an original and fourteen copies applies as usual.

Repeater S.P.A.R.C. Newsletter No. 1.

September 22, 1974

To: All S.P.A.R.C. Repeater Team members.

This newsletter is the first of a series. It is anticipated that newsletters may be issued occasionally, on an irregular time interval, as the need arises.

The Executive Council of the St. Petersburg Amateur Radio Club has voted to accept the Repeater Team as an integral part of the club and the repeater project as a legitimate club project.

There will be no initiation fees for Repeater Team membership, as most team members will have already paid initiation fees to the club. Team members who have paid initiation fees to the team may have this fee (1) refunded, or (2) converted to club initiation fee (if not already a club member), or (3) considered an extra donation for the repeater project, as desired.

While it is not manadatory that repeater team and repeater users be club members, it is desireable to be so in order to receive repeater news published in "S.P.A.R.C. - GAP", the club journal. Regular club membership costs \$1 initiation fee plus dues \$4 annually, due on January 1st. Members joining between Oct. 1 and Dec. 31 pay \$1 and those joining between July 1 and Oct. 1 pay \$2 dues for the balance of the year. The spouse of a regular member may become a club member by paying \$1 per year dues.

We will not demand fees from anybody for using the repeater, however, local hams using the machine frequently will be invited to help support it with a \$10 per year donation. Persons donating will be considered team members, regardless of whether they are club members.

The Team Treasurer, Frank Woltemar K4SQ, will be considered an assistant to the club treasurer and will account for repeater funds separately in order that these funds may be readily available for construction and operation of the repeater. Any excess repeater funds will be expended on repeater projects or transferred to the club general treasury annually. Requirement for the \$10 per year donation will be re-evaluated annually and may be raised or lowered to cover expenses.

The "Repeater Committee" is a standing committee of the club.

K4SCL, as Repeater Trustee, is now a member of the Executive Committee, same as the W4GAC Trustee.

WA4FNY is considered "First Assistant" to the Repeater Trustee, having general charge of such matters personnel accounting, gripes and morale, organizing team members for required projects, supervising control operators and establishing duty schedules for them, also public relations. He may appoint assistants as necessary. Control operators are: WA4FNY, WA4FNX, WA4KDL, WA4GDM, W4MCA, K4KE, WB4ZPU, WA4FPS. Each will receive a letter of authority from repeater trustee.

It is now 6 weeks since our license was applied for. If there was anything basically wrong with the application, we should have heard. Our license could arrive any time. We are ready to go operational with local control. Remote control lines are being worked on.

On 9-21-74 duplexer was installed and tuned. WA4KDL and WA4WBM did a fine construction job. Tx side rejects Rx freq 107.7 db. Rx side rejects Tx freq 120 db. Duplexer loss to rcvr (antenna terminal to receiver terminal) is 1.0 db. Duplexer loss from xmtr (transmitter terminal to antenna terminal) measured 0.96 db by one method and 0.57 db by another method. Best estimate is 0.76 db. We get a cool 70 watts out of the duplexer. Tx pwr imput 160 watts.

HAL ID-1A CW Station Identifier hooked up and working fine.

Adjusted IDC for max 5.0 KHz deviation, loud vowel sounds into station microphone, them set Audio Coupler to produce 3.3 KC Tx deviation out with 3.3 KC RX deviation received. Checked repeater linearity as fol: 1 kc dev in gave 1 kc dev out; 2KC-2KC; 3KC-3KC; 3.3KC-3.3Kc; 4KC-4KC; 4.5KC-4.3KC limiting; 5.0KC-4.8KC limiting.

Our antenna pattern, from manufacturers drawings, gives a broad cardioid with 6 to 8 db gain in all directions except near SSW where it is -4 db. Our effective range for a 3 micro-volts per meter field strength or giving a 1 microvolt signal out of a quarter-wave whip, calculated per page 99 of "FM and Repeaters" handbook, ARRL, should be about 38 miles in all directions except 32 miles to SSW. Higher gain mobile antennas and more sensitive receivers with higher power mobile xmtrs will do betty

Control lines and control equipment are biggest "unfinished" area, but work is progressing.

Several people already have crystals for our 147.66 input/147.06 output. If you don't have yours, better get going.
