

FLORIDA GULF COAST RADIO COUNCIL HIDDEN TRANSMITTER 2 - METER EVENT

This event will take place Sunday, November 7,1976, starting at 10:00 A.M. The starting point will be the front entrance of the Convention Center. 
Florida Gulf Coast Radio Council Meeting:

Official ARRL Bulletin NR 595 ---- Attention DXers. May 1976 QST announced the addition of Okino Tori-shima to the ARRL Countries List.

Advice from the JARL indicates that the first contact with the DXpedition station 7J1RL took place at 0030 UTC May 30, 1976. Confirmations for contacts for this new country, made on or after May 30, 1976, may be submitted for DXCC credit starting September 1, 1976. Contacts price to May 30 will continue to be credited toward the Ogasawara listing on the ARRL Countries list.

Official Bulletin NR 596 ---- Special events station WG1JFK will be on the air for 48 hours beginning 000 UTC July 3 in celebration of the U.S.Bicentennial. This unique station will be operating from a plot of land, within Great Britain, presented to the U.S. in memorian to the late President John F. Kennedy. It is considered a U.S. station on U.S.territory. WG1JFK will operate on all bands with the exclusion of 160 meters.

Official ARRL Bulletin NR 597 ---- As a membership service ARRL is providing a chart showing all available 1 X 2 calls as of early June in the contiguous 48 states. This chart may be obtained by sending a self addressed envelope with 24 cents postage addressed to Call Signs, ARRLL .

Official ARRL Bulletin NR 598 ---- Headquarters is looking for volunteers for our recently expanded Intruder Watch program. As part of preparation for WARC-79, ARRL will be playing a much more active role in the program, to more aggressively defend our amateur bands. If you are willing to devote a few hours a week to patrolling the amateur bands for non-amateur stations, write Intruder Watch, c/o ARRL. 225 Main Street, Newington, Ct. 06111 . *******

FGCRC

Ticket designs, and forms, are at the printers being processed. Each club will receive a bloc of tickets to be sold either to, or by, their members. Heavy local and area support for the convention is expected, without too much dependence on out of area ticket sales. In this case, 'area' is defined as that part of Florida lying within the central nelt from Coast to Coast.

ARRL has requested the Council to inform and solicit the endorsements of the Division Director, and the SCM's of the Northern and Southern Florida. This request was not understood as it is assumed that the convention DOES have the support of these officials. Anything else would be ridiculous, and it is wondered if the HQ Staff, in Newington, is "au courant' with their own scheduling of coming Conventions.

The Hidden Transmitter Hunt will be staged by DPARC, and will take place on Sunday starting at 10:00 AM. To faciliate the printing of programs, I have taken it upon my-

self to make-up a list of operating rules, to govern the event.

The possibility of having a Tampa Bay Area Call Book printed was discussed. This call book would list the calls, names, and addresses of amateurs in the Pasco; Pinellas; Hillsborough; Manatee and Sarasota Counties. This data can be obtained from the printers of the Amateur Call Book who will supply call signs and addresses according to Zip Code areas, at a nominal fee. With advertising, and a sale price of 50¢, this item could show a profit as well as being an operating aid for amateurs in these areas.

These will be an advanced sale of tickets, but no mailing service will be provided. Advance sale tickets will be picket-up at the door upon arrival. Those tickets that have been paid for, but not picked-up by convention time, will still be eligible for prizes

where the winner need not be present to win.

RTTY NWES

We continue with the History of Teletype as written in Ron Guentzler W8BBB's series of articles in the RTTY JOURNAL.

The test of the first working model of the Morkrum printing machine was a success. In 1910, the second largest telegraph company in the U.S., the Postal Telegraph System, bought teleprinters made by Morkrum and had them installed on its New York to Boston circuits. Postal Telegraphs' major concern was whether or not the Morkrum machines would perform well in bad weather - like their salt, when it rained, the messages poured through i ! By 1912, Postal Telegraph had eight circuits working with Morkrum equipment, the longest being a thousand miles from New York to Chicago. (The Machines probably operated around twenty words per minute)

In 1912, Western Union had six circuits in operation using the Morkrum equipment, Several railroads then followed suit.

By 1914, Morkrum had a tape perforator system in use for off-line preparation and on-line transmission. Its first major use was by the Associated Press to distribute news stories to Page printers at its member newspapers in the New York area.

The name "Teletype", and the scroll symbol were introduced as part of the advertizing promotion on the Model 11, introduced in 1921. The Model 11 operated at 40 WPM. It used a type wheel and printed on paper tape. One of the advertizing flyers for the Model 11 stated: "Teletype - Don't Say It - Don't Write it - Print It."

The Model 12 page printer using type bars was introduced in 1922. It was the first machine placed into widespread use by businesses on private circuits. This machine was so rugged that its first installation - 37 machines put in use for the Chicago Police Dept. in 1922 - was not replaced until 1956. Approximately 12,000 Model 12's were sold.

In 1923, the first Teletype by radio (RTTY) messages were sent 30 miles from the factory to the home of the president, Sterling Morton.

THE SPARC REPEATER TEAM TRANSMITTER HUNT.


What is a Transmitter Hunt? First of all it's a non-official group, which does not exclude anyone from participating, that gathers each Sunday afternoon at 2 P.M. on 146.490 mHz. Incidently, 146.490 mHz. is the alternate simplex frequence when the repeater is off the air.

The Hunts restarted in September of 1975 and have been held almost every Sunday. There are approximately 6 regulars and we've had as many as 15 to show up.

Our purpose is to have an unofficial but organized group capable of finding any transmitter tormenting the input frequence of the repeater. Fun is the name of our training game. The "Bunny"has the option of setting new rules for his hunt but following the safety guidelines of previous hunts. Any changes should be given on the SPARC 6:30 P.M. net the Sunday before the Hunt.

You too can join us and stay at home because we need fixed stations to give initial bearings - strength of signal - and updated bearings. We miss the able assistance of K4SCL as a plotter. W4GPL receives bearings first from hunters and then from fixed stations on 146.490 mHz. After plotting he transmits the intersection of the fixes on the hunt frequency and on 6 meters.

Anyone desiring to get their feet wet come on out, you'll see everyone checking each others equipment for new ideas - maybe back to the drawing board - or to your friendly parts store for an attenuater or field strength meter - the "dog eared" antenna book will be checked and rechecked. Would you believe the drivers for the hunters are debriefed after each hunt, but that's another chapter, only after more research.





The Repeater Team met at Red Cross Henderson Hall June 29, 1976 with 24 members present. Coffee by K4RXO. Doughnuts picked up by K5IHH. The refreshment fund has become essentially self-supporting through donations of members enjoying the doughnuts and coffee.

K4DRN has been appointed Assistant Emergency Coordinator for 10 meters. Pinellas AREC now has 50 members. The emergency communication plan is at the printers and should be partly distributed by the time you read this. Printing cost is expected to be 53¢ per copy, so individuals desireing copies will be asked to contribute 50¢.

Our next meeting will be at the Florida Power club repeater site, the power plant on Weedon Island, August 3 at 7:30 P.M. Subsequent meetings are scheduled for 3rd Fridays monthly at Red Cross....

1. Full Novice privileges for Technician Class Licensees.

2. ANovice reaching the end of his license term can retest for a new Novice immediately; the one year wait is discontinued.

3. Novices may run 250 watts d.c. POWER INPUT.

- 4. All licensees using the Novice segments of the bands are also limited to 250 watts.
- 5. Full credit will be granted for examination elements completed by mail; e.g Conditionals are "grandfathered" to General, Technicians C to Technician.
- 6. Element 2, the novice written test, will be a part of all exams.
- 7. The number of distinct license classes is reduced from 10 to 5 by this action.
- 8. The future availability of mail exams is limited to Novices only, except in cases of protracted physical disability. These changes will be effective July 23,1976




