

JOHN H. MERADA- WB4LWB

John was born in Plymouth, Mass, Feb. 25th 1907. He attended grade school up to Jr. high and after school worked as a messenger boy for the Western Union Telegraph Co. He was very proud of this job as he wore an attractive uniform that was furnished by the company that made him a big deal around the boys in his part of town. (At least he thought so.) In those days while waiting for telegrams for delivery the company required him to learn the Morse Code and practise on a sounder. To John this was very fascinating and by the time he was 14 years old was a fully qualified operator. He went from town to town as a relief operator. After the novelty wore off John tried a job with the NYC Railroad claiming to be 22 years old, however the bonding company found out his true age and he was promptly relieved of his job. While this was a disappointment to him as other types of work was uninteresting to John. In October of 1925 he tried join the Navy as a radio operator but enlistment has changed with the years and it took too long. in the meantime he joined the U.S. Coast Guard. He was enlisted as a striker radio operator and soon become third class radioman. Over the years John served on many Coast Guard Cutters, patrol boats, and Radio Sta-

tions. While stationed in St. Petersburg, Fla. , He met a little nurse employed at Mound Park Hospital and in November 1933, John and Minnie Lee Hopson were married. After his marriage his next assignment was to Jacksonville Florida to put up a radio station and later was transferred to Coast Guard Air Station, Miami, Florida. While there and at Dinner Key, John and Minnie's first boy was born. This was in 1935 and he was named Robert. Today Bob is a pharmacist in St. Petersburg. He also is a member of the great Ham Fraternity with call letters WB4MCF. As events transpired he was stationed at most of the Coast Guard Air Stations. While located in San Diego California their 2nd son, James was born, June 16th 1942. Shortly thereafter John was transferred to various war time activities, such as navy transports manned by Coast Guard Crews. He was promoted to Chief Warrant Officer. The war years were very unpleasant for John, being away from home and family but he is not remiss about it conjecturing on the fact that he did return where many didnt. John's education was obtained in college level courses from service schools, Capitol Radio Engineering, etc furnished by the service. After WW2, John served as C.G. Electronics Repair, Boston and Argentia, Newfoundland with Ice Patrol detail flying from that point as logist support to Loran stations etc. The last duty was at U.S. Coast Guard Air Station, Lindberg Field, San Diego. He retired after 32 years of service. SPARC is indeed lucky to have a man of John's character as an officer (Vice President) and Sparc-Gap Editor. May his star shine brilliant for many years to come.





RTTY NEWS

We continue with the History of Teletype as written in Ron Guentzler W8BBB's series of articles in the RTTY JOURNAL.

In 1924, a patent conflict between the Morkrum Company and the Kleinschmidt Electric Co., which also manufactured teleprinters, led to a meeting of the interests and an eventual merger under the name Morkrum-Kleinschmidt Corporation; Sterling Morton was the president, and Edward Kleinschmidt and Howard Krum were the vice presidents.

LANTE Y

The model 14 type-bar type printer was introduced as a rugged low maintenance machine in 1925. The development resulted from requests by the telegraph companys who wanted to have teleprinters on all their circuits. Because it printed on paper tape, the machine was simpler than a page printer, and it could handle messages a bit faster because it did not have to carriage return or line feed.

For simplicity, the company's name was changed from Morkrum-Kleinschmidt to Teletype Corporation in 1928.

15,500 machines were made from 1918 to 1927; 12,700 were produced in 1928 and 25,200 were made in 1929.

Teletype Corp. was bought by the American Telephone and Telegraph Company in 1930 and was made a subsidiary of its Western Electric Company.





FLORIDA GULF COAST AMATEUR RADIO COUNCIL; Inc.

Synopsis of Meeting of July 14, 1976

The two main topics discussed at this meeting were the contents of last meeting's minutes, and the incorporation of the Council.

Discussion of last month's report were the estimated expenses to be incurred, in staging the Convention, and these expenses proposed as a tentative budget, by Fred, K4KIK. This point was brought forward by the representative (Director) of the New Port Richey Club.

Evidently, the members of the New Port Richey Club; after reading the Minutes, misconstrued their meaning, or - did not have them properly interpreted by their representative. They assumed that the proposal, presented by K4KIK, was an accepted budget, and that the Council had indebted themselves for almost \$6,000. Which raised the further question, as tomwhat extent the member clubs were obligated in the event of a default of payment of these debts. New Port Richey wanted immediate answers to these questions, with the implied hint that - unless the answers were satisfactory - they would withdraw from the Council. There was also the question as to the responsibility and the obligation of the various Directors, when voting on proposals, and to what extent the member Clubs were involved by such votes.

The Chair - after deploring the implied threat in these questions - undertook to clarify the matter, along with the Council's Attorney of Record. The figures presented by K4KIK were an estimation, and NOT a budget. Nor were these figures approved, or voted upon. The Council HAS NOT indebted, nor obligated, itself for any expenses. Bills presented have been paid - the Council is financially solvent - and the projected financial prospect is good. The only obligation that the Council has, in staging the Convention, is the renting of 200 rooms and staging a Banquet at the Hotel. The meeting rooms, convention hall and auditorium are presented as a service by the hotel, and there is no costs for the usage of these facilities.

The Attorney then clarified the question as to what extent member clubs were responsible, in the unforseen event of a default by the Council on financial debts. The answer to this is NOTHING! By incorporating the Council, any debtor must look to the assets of the Council for satisfaction of any financial claims. He cannot look to any member club, or individual member, for satisfaction of any judgement.

It was further pointed out that each member club is obligated, and bound, by the actions of their delegated representatives in conducting the business of the Council. As a personal aside, I would like to iterate - therefor - that each club should choose it's representatives carefully, and with consideration of these factors. This expatiation seemed to satisfy the New Port Richey Director and the meeting passed on to other business.

Further business conducted with the Attorney, consisted of drawing up petitions to the I.R.S. and U.S. Post Office, for Tax Exempt status and bulk mailing rates. There seems to be no foreseeable problems in these areas, other than the interminable amount of papers required to be filed. It was pointed out that - if we did not get bulk mailing rates - the expense of mailing a letter would go from 1.7¢ to 7.7¢ per item. So Tax Exempt status is important.

Due to the indisposition of Gene WB4VWO, I was asked to present his report as Chairman of the Prize Committee. Very briefly; the total expenses of the committee were \$37.69, and the prizes donated amacunted to \$595.00. Gene has obtained committee approval for the purchase of the main door prize. This consists of a DRAKE TR-4C; RV-4; MS-4; AC-4; or a complete HF Station. This represents a retail value of over \$900.00, for the pruchase price of only \$503.00. Gene also has many more 'goodies' on hand, and promised, and prize-wise, it looks like an exciting Convention. Gene's report was very well received by the Council, and they are very pleased with his Chairmanship and efforts. Gene has been receiving \$15 value, for every \$1 spent.

Exposition Booths are practically sold-out, there being only three left uncommitted. I have been error eously reporting that the price for a booth was \$37.50. The actual price is \$75.00! with a cost of \$50 per booth, to the Council, this price represents a profit of \$25 per booth.

The tickets are at the Printers and should be available for sale by July 24th. Tickets are the responsibility of the Clearwater A.R.S., and should be distributed for sale by the end of the month. It is proposed that advance purchase and registration will entitle the purchaser to three (3) extra thances for the main prize. Registration at the door will entitle you to only one (1) chance. You may also purchase additional chances - 11 for \$10.00. Or; 30 for \$25.00.

F.C.C. will conduct license exams on the ninth floor, on November sixth. Exams with code elements will start at 9:00 AM, and non-code exams at 11:00 AM. Persons wishing to avail themselves of this service should send their application and fees to the Tampa Office, of the F.C.C., by October 29, 1976, specifying an exam date of Nov. 6, 1976.




