SPARC Repeater News

We regret that K4FCW has found it necessary to resign as Secretary of the Repeater Team and as a Control Operator. We sincerely appreciate his loyal and dedicated performance in these functions from the initial inception of the Team. WA4KCR will take over the Secretary position upon his return from abroad. K4QCG has also resigned as a Control Operator. Thanks for your work in the past, Ken. Recently appointed new Control Operators are WB4KSJ, K5IHH and W4CSH. W4IRA continues to perform in an outstanding manner as Coordinator of Control Operators. Other Control Operators currently appointed are WA4CTM WA4FNX WA4FNY WA4GDM W4GPL K4ISS WA4KCR WA4KDL K4KE WA4LTE WB4LXH K4NAN W4NOK WA4RQQ K4RXO K4SCL K4TH WA4TJG and WB4ZPU. Without these dedicated people giving so generously of their time and care, the repeater could not operate. We owe them a great debt of gratitude.

Recently the Red Cross, South Pinellas Chapter, requested an up-date on Repeater Team members for use in the forthcoming revision of their Disaster Organization Manual. I gave them 116 names and addresses of Team members who had contributed 1977 dues by about April 20th. There are several other people that we feel would like to be Team members but have neglected to take care of their 1977 dues. They will probably miss being listed in the forthcoming roster. Sorry I have not been able to have up-to-date information on dues contributions and have not been able to contact all former members.

As most of you know, the 220 MHz band is getting quite active locally with perhaps 50 Amateurs using it. The Largo repeater, WR4AVI, on 223.34/224.94 is doing a fine job, but we need a little more positive coverage in down town St. Petersburg. Considerable planning has gone forward towards establishing a 220 repeater in southern Pinellas County. W4APV is heading up this project, assisted by W4CF, K4ISS and W4CPL. Several possible sites have been investigated -- none entirely satisfactory. W4APV has the basic repeater and duplexer in hand. Antenna and coax will be ordered as soon as we can settle on a site. A frequency assignment, 223.30/224.90, has been obtained from the Florida Repeater Council, Frequency Coordinator. Several local Amateurs have crystalized for this pair, as well as the club simplex frequency 223.66. AGL Electronics in Clearwater is stocking 220 MHz equipment, including crystals for frequencies in local use. At the last Team meeting a motion was passed that the "2 Meter Team support the 220 Repeater, if feasible." Many of us are willing to personally contribute whatever is necessary to make the 220 machine go, but it is felt that Team funds must be conserved to support our rather tight budget for the "2 Meter Team."

New rates for our telephone for WR4ALM repeater control has us paying \$23.36 per month -- up from \$18.81. The rate increase was not altogether unexpected, so there is enough in our budget to take care of it.

Recent installation of a new deviation control pot has enabled us to reset modulation back up to 5.0 KC on WR4ALM.
