OUR NEXT MEETING WILL BE ON AUGUST 4, 1978 AT THE RED CROSS HEADQUARTERS 818 - 4th Street No., St. Petersburg, FL

Mr. Fred Crosby, of the Ruskin Weather Bureau, will be with us to present a short talk and film on "How To Recognize A Storm". It promises to be an informative and useful evening.

The meeting of July 7, 1978 was called to order by Rex Cottrell WLGPL at 8:05 P.M. Fifty-five members and guests were introduced and welcomed.

Ms. Mindy Moore, Disaster Services and Safety Services Director of the local chapter of the American Red Cross presented a talk and a slide program depicting what a disaster would do to our community and what the Red Cross is prepared to do to help. She also explained our role as Amateur Radio Operators in relation to the overall disaster plan. She told of tornado and hurricane safety rules, and presented everyone with disaster relief and preparedness leaflets.

The meeting was recessed at 8:55 P.M. for coffee and doughnuts, and was called back to order at 9:15 P.M.

The minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved, and the Treasurer's report was read and approved.

Herb Tuell WAIRA gave the Control Station report. He said that we are in good shape for operators.

Linda Saunders WALHKP has donated a newer Call Book to the Club Station. Our old one was about ten years old.

Hank Huth WALWKO gave the Publicity report. He said that it is still difficult to get adequate publicity for our Club or for Amateur Radio in general.

Woody Huddleston K5SCL gave the Engineering report. He said that the excessive heat at the repeater site has caused necessary tube replacements in the final stage.

Woody also reported that Herb Tuell WhIRA has resigned as Repeater Control Chairman. Thanks and appreciation was given to Herb by the membership.

Woody also gave the Disaster Committee report. He said that Pinellas County has a new emergency plan which involves all city, County and Red Cross personnel.

Woody recently attended the meeting of the Communications Committee of the Pinellas County Hospital Association. It was suggested that the area hospitals purchase and install 2 meter and 220 meter antennas in each hospital along with a desk adequate for setting up a radio station. Some of the hospitals have done this and have been very cooperative. Some haven't. It is hoped that more will take advantage of Amateur Radio during emergency drills.

Woody also reported that the new 911 emergency number is operational.

The proposed autopatch on the SPARC repeater will need further discussion before being voted on by the members. Additional imput is requested by the committee.

Rex discussed the use of the term "Break" and "Break-Break" to get into a QSO. It was generally agreed that the use of your call is sufficient to break into an existing QSO, and "Break-Break" should only be used in case of emergency.

There will be another SPARC Repeater Team Dinner on July 14th. Frank Ryll WhVIP told about the plans to honor the wife of the late Ed Blatt with Lifetime Honorary Membership in SPARC. The ceremony will take place at the dinner. Martha (Sweety) Blatt is a fine woman, who did so much for her husband, and for the Club. Everyone come.





HISTORY OF ST. PETERSBURG AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

Tracing back amateur radio in St. Petersburg, we find only three or four hams in 1925; the 1927 Callbook lists twelve in St. Petersburg, out of 650 in the 4th District. In 1928, amateurs gained some recognition when W4APY-Don Geegan & other locals set up a radio link to Okeechobee for Florida Power. Local ham population here continued to grow with a total of 30 listed in 1930.

During 1933, John Fill, William Grogan, Garvin Combs-W4LF, George Slagle, Bob Cain-W4BQW, Don Geegan-W4APY & Phil McMasters-W4BCZ started meeting regularly in the radio shop of R. Preece, Jr., until W4BCZ purchased the radio shop & moved it to 9th St. & Burlington Ave. (across from Sears). W4DJI was issued as a shop call & code practice transmissions were made on the 160 meter band.

SPARC was finally organized in 1934, with W4BCZ-Phil, President; W4DBG-James Tippey, Vice-President; & W4CQZ-Harry Fishel, Secretary-Treasurer. Added to the membership was: W4CSJ-Bill Mangold; W4DWU-Bruce Blackburn; W4COW-Wesley Randles; W4DAP-Casey Ingram; W4DBP-Lowell White; W4LF-Garvin Combs; W4CZF-Ed Wallis; W4DBO-Howard Rees & many others as Club activity progressed. The Club affiliated with the ARRL & was instrumental in the appointment of W4BCZ-Phil as SCM, which office he held in 1934 & 1935. He was among those who attended the first Florida S. E. Division ARRL Convention, in Miami, with an invitation for the convention to be held next in St. Petersburg.

1935 marked the end of the "man's world" in the local amateur group, when the first local YL, Edith White received the call of W4DOM. SPARC sponsored a 160-meter phone net with the ringing title of "Meters of the Morning".

1936

SPARC was host to the S.E. Division ARRL Convention. President, Ed Wallis-W4CZF; General Chairman, Phil McMaster-W4BCZ & Entertainment Chairman, Wes Randles-W4COW were responsible for a capacity crowd enjoying a Beach Party at Treasure Island; a tour of WSUN & the Roebling Estates in Clearwater; Wouff Hong ceremonies & a banquet at the Suwannee Hotel.

1937

W4BCZ-Phil closed his radio shop so SPARC meetings were held at the homes of various members, with the XYLs furnishing refreshments after the meetings.

1938

Meetings continued & W4GAC-Lex Herron, of Marysville, Tenn. moved to St. Petersburg area & became interested in SPARC, becoming an active member.

1939


W4GAC-Lex's offer was accepted to use his home in Seminole for regular meetings. Activity picked up in the meetings & the XYLs' interest increased, as Bette (XYL of Lex) entertained them until the meeting was over & the boys joined the group for a social get-together.

1940

Lex purchased a large home at Sunset Beach, so the Club meetings moved over there, where they had a building complete with ham rig, furnished by Lex. The XYLs met in the house with Bette.





HISTORY OF ST. PETERSBURG AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

Continued

1941

SPARC had grown, but Sunday, December 7th, with the attack on Pearl Harbor, ended all ham activities. Many of the boys went into the service, others were employed in defense plants. Some monitored the ether waves for the Government & at least one, W4EYI-Spence, later received a Navy Citation for his work in this field. On Sept. 13, 1942, W4GAC-Lex turned his equipment: a Hallicrafter HT4, 600 watt transmitter & an SX-28 Hallicrafter Communication Receiver, over to the Army for use in World War II.

1942-1945

Club inactive, as hams off the air due to the War & working in defense plants, in service, etc.

On July 31st, 1945, W4GAC-Lex joined the Silent Keys. Lex at that time was manager of Radio Station WTSP & was recovering from an operation when he passed away suddenly. In tribute to Lex's great work for the Club & community, the Club applied for & received his call W4GAC.

1946

The amateur bands started to become active, with local round tables on 10-meters, which finally resulted in the boys & XYLs meeting at the Municipal Pier to reorganize SPARC. W4HUY-Smitty was elected President & W4TYO-Bing Crosby as Vice-President.

1947-1948

Not too many records on these years; however it is known SPARC continued to grow & held their meetings at the N. Worth Gable Armory. The XYLs would meet at the various houses & provide refreshments after the Club meetings.

<u> 1949</u>

SPARC continued to meet regularly, but changed their meeting place to the Mirror Lake High School.

1950

Needing more room, the meetings were held at the Recreational Center, located on Beach Drive South. The XYLs still continued to meet as an auxiliary of SPARC, meeting at the various houses & serving refreshments to the fellows after their meetings.

1951

SPARC activity really started picking up. W4RUR-Ed Blatt started a 10-meter code class. During July the Club & City of St. Petersburg set up an emergency station on three bands, in the basement of the City Hall. The members then donated many hours of their time & parts to build a portable generator, which consisted of a 1930 Plymouth motor & chassis, an axle from a model A Ford, gas tank from an airplane, governor from a concrete mixer, a 110-volt 60-cycle generator, wheels & muffler from a V-8. It was also this year that really started the XYLs getting their license, as Naomi, XYL of W4EYI-Spence, succeeded in passing her General Class license, receiving the call of W4TDK.

1952

To ease the "growing pains" situation, SPARC moved their meeting headquarters to the main building of the Arts & Crafts Group. In August of this year, W4TDK-Naomi passed the Class A license, along with W4TZW-Thor. Naomi was enjoying hamming so much, other XYLs started showing interest with the result that W4TDK started a code class in November at her home.

1953

Meetings were well attended, with the girls playing cards, while the fellows conducted their meeting in another room. A social time always followed, with the XYLs taking turns as hostess & serving coffee & doughnuts. W4TDK-Naomi's first

The Senate Subcommittee on Communications held hearings yesterday on S—864, Senator Barry Goldwater's RFI Bill. It would allow FCC to set minimum standards for the susceptibility of audio and visual equipment to interception of radio signals. The ARRL crew present for the hearing were President Harry J. Dannals, W2HD, Atlantic Division Director Harry A. McConaghy, W3SW, General Counsel Robert M. Booth, W3PS, Assistant General Manager Dave Sumner, K1ZZ and Washington Coordinator Hal Steinman, K1FHN. Paraguay, Peru, Trinidad and Tobago, Uruguay and
Venezuela. In addition U.S. Amateurs can handle
traffic for U.S. amateurs operating 4UlITU, stations
in Greenland bearing the XP prefix, United States
stations operating portable from Barbados identified
as portable 8P6, and only with WD5AJE/SU in the
Sinai. Note that third party traffic is no longer
permitted with HZIAB in Saudi Arabia. AR






