





SPARC REPEATER NEWS

Hopefully, by the time you read this, we will have our new repeater with autopatch on the air. It was scheduled for shipment early in January. At this writing, January 9th, we are "on pins and needles" expecting delivery any day. I hope it doesn't turn out like my new Heathkit FM Deviation Meter, which has had three postponements of scheduled shipping date and no kit yet, or like the accessories for my DSI Frequency Meter, bought and paid for on October 2nd but not received yet.

The nationwide Simulated Emergency Test (S.E.T.) is scheduled for January 27-28. Hopefully, you may receive the SPARC GAP by then. Florida Radio Amateurs will be holding a Statewide S.E.T. on February 3-4. We hope you will review the S.E.T. announcement in December QST, pages 77-79, and take part on both week-ends. At this writing it is not clear how our drills will go, but we should make ready our emergency equipment and be ready to respond to any simulated (or real) emergency situations. And don't forget to send at least the two messages recommended in QST.

Last month we outlined a procedure for using autopatch. We received an objection to the requirement of giving the phone number being called, based on reluctance to divulge unlisted numbers of members and friends to be called. I wonder if there are many members who object to giving the number for recorder-logging purposes? This procedure has been widely accepted as a way to fulfill the requirement of identifying the third party for the log. If revealing the phone number is seriously objectionable, I believe we could fulfill legal requirements by stating name and address of party called.

Now that we have received one objection to what we wrote last month, we know that one person read it. Does anybody else read it?





CONSTRUCTION NOTES ON SIMPLE 2 METER 1/4 WAVE ANTENNA

"Jack" Saunders (for Linda, WA4HKP)

The antenna described below was constructed in accordance with verbal instructions given by Kim Cole, WB4ARZ/WAØMAA, but with modifications. Kim said he had used a PL-258 as the base and soldered 3 radials and vertical element made from coat hanger wires to the PL-258.

We wound up with a bit more sophisticated type antenna because of parts and time available. Construction was begun with a 2-1/2" OD round washer drilled with a 5/8" hole in the center to mount the SO-239. Four clearance holes were drilled in the washer and the holes in the SO-239 were tapped for 8-32 screws. The washer was then drilled with 4 holes to mount the radials. The SO-239 was mounted on the washer with 8-32 x 3/8" screws. Next, we flattened 1" of both ends of 7/8" tubing and drilled one end of each of the four pieces to clear #10 screws. The radials were mounted on the washer using $10-32 \times 3/8$ " screws, washers and nuts, then cutting the radials to approximately 19-1/2" each. The vertical was then cut so that the two sections could be adjusted between 18" to 21" and soldered to the center of the SO-239.

In order to better protect this "jewel" from the Gulf salt spray, we formed a mold around the base of the radials and vertical and encapsulated approximately 1-1/2" deep and 3" round with clear polyester casting resin. When the resin had set we removed the mold and masking tape, then sanded and smoothed the rough edges.

Still not satisfied, we masked the vertical and threads of the SO-239 and spray painted the washer, hardware and radials with gold lacquer.

The antenna was then mounted atop a section of TV mast using 3 screws tapped into the mast to hold the PL-259 and RG-8/U cable running inside the mast section.

After initial tryout with SWR meter, the vertical and radials were adjusted or cut for best reception and transmission. The final installation was completed with the radials cut to approximately 19-3/8" each and the vertical at 19-1/4".

This antenna was originally installed about 3 years ago at 21' above ground level and has consistently enabled Linda to reach the Tampa Bay area and Manasota repeaters from the South Pasadena location. When conditions are good she also reaches the Orlando area. It was recently raised to 35' above ground and seems to be working perfectly.


