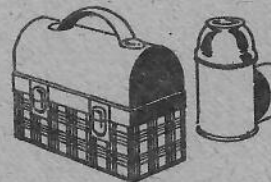

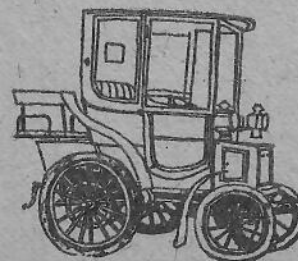

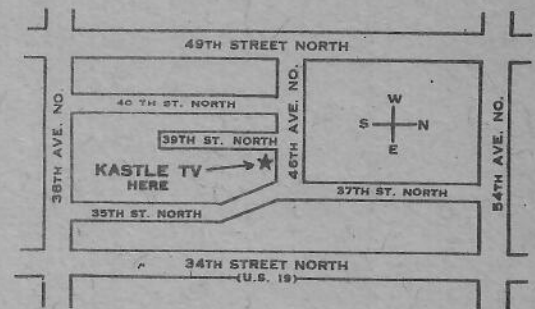

The meeting of February 2, 1979 was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by
President John MacDonald WD4COL. Seventy-two members and guests were
welcomed and introduced.

John WD4COL asked for a volunteer to maintain the guest book and
act as a hostess for our meetings. Marjorie Ryll has been doing an out-
standing job for the past year and has asked to be relieved of the duty.
Jean Endicott volunteered to take over the job.

Tickets to the upcoming Pinellas Park Hamfest were offered for sale
during the meeting.

Gary N4AXN presented Emergency Cardiac Care cards to Oliver WD4KGY
and Mike N4AUO. Oliver and Mike recently attended a CPR class.

It was suggested that members renew their ARRL membership through
our Club, whereby the Club will realize a portion of the ARRL dues.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Corrections are as
follows: Andy's call is WB4TLH, not WB4ALH as recorded; his on-the-air
code practice is only held on Saturday evenings, not Saturday and Sunday
evenings as recorded; Phil WB4YKW needed a ride on January 15th, not
February 15th as recorded. The minutes were approved as corrected.

The Treasurer's Report was read and approved.

John Smith W4ACG reported that our Club station W4GAC is ready for
the SET exercises to be held on February 3 & 4, 1979.

Woody K4SCL reported that the repeater is operating normally with
several new control operators recently qualified. The new repeater was
shipped on January 31, 1979, but has not been received as yet.

The annual ARRL dues have been recently raised from \$12.00 a year
to \$18.00 a year starting in April. Membership can be renewed for five
years in advance at the old price, or a lifetime membership can be ob-
tained for twenty-five times the annual dues.

The weekend of February 3 & 4, 1979 has been designated as the
annual SET exercises for the State of Florida. It was suggested that one
of the messages to be sent should go to our new State Representative from
District 8, Ron Johnson WB4LIJ, who is attempting to pass a bill reducing
the cost of Amateur Radio License plates.

Hank WA4WKO reported that anything to be submitted to FLORIDA SKIP
must be received by them before the 25th of the month to be included in
the upcoming issue.

Woody K4SCL said that the Red Cross has sent a letter to area papers,
radio and TV stations, police and fire departments, and hospitals explain-
ing about SET and asking for their support. He asked that anyone seeing
a story in a newspaper about SET cut it out and send it to him.

Dan WB4TZR of the Florida Gulf Coast Amateur Radio Council talked to us about the upcoming Sand Key Convention on November 17 & 18, 1979. There will be thirty commercial booths; an outside and inside flea market; and busses running hourly from the City of Clearwater parking lot to make parking easier. Dan said that there are nine area Amateur radio clubs in the Council, and ninety-eight people attended the last meeting. He asked for a delegate to represent SPARC. The Sand Key Convention is really shaping up, and is expected to be the biggest one yet.

The meeting adjourned at 9:35 p.m.

SIMULATED EMERGENCY TEST February 3rd & 4th, 1979

Florida Amateurs, under the auspices of ARRL, participated in the SET activities on Saturday & Sunday, the third and fourth of this month.

For the purpose of this test Pinellous County was divided into three coordinated sections. CARS and the Large repeater to cover the Northern section, while the Center section was covered by the METRO repeater and we, of SPARC, covered the Southern section from 54th Ave.N. to the Southern County line.

W4GAC was ably manned for approximately 11 hours on these two days of the test. A total of 209 messages, of a simulated emergency nature, were logged by W4GAC alone, a total message count for the County has as yet not been tabulated. Thirty or more of us worked in our Southern section plus a great many more County wide. All of those HAMS assisting created a very favorable impression and we all learned ways to make the next one even better.

OFFICIAL BULLETIN NR 741 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CT JANUARY 18, 1979 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

A 60 day extension of time in which to file comments in General Docket 78-365 has been granted by the FCC. This docket concerns the protection of FCC monitoring stations from radio interference. It is covered in detail in February 1979 QST. The new comment deadline is March 22, 1979. On a new subject, OSCAR 8 experiments using combined modes A and J are to be conducted on January 24, 27, 28, 31 February 3 and 4. The test is to evaluate NICAD recharge memory by forcing discharge of onboard batteries. During these days users will be permitted general operation and are asked to report unusual findings to ARRL headquarters. If the spacecraft is off during these periods that will indicate ground control selection of Mode D. On another matter an OSCAR DXpedition is pending and will be announced on periodic updates of the OSCAR bulletin. AR

One of these areas is the acquisition of a new HF rig for W4GAC. We presently have a Drake which is being sold (contact John Smith for details now), and a Kenwood.

The executive committee has approved a necktie type of badge for the official club identification/logo. We are uncertain as to the color and design. The badge itself will be 3½" X 1½" and will be of the western necktie variety. SPARC REPEATER NEWS

The big news, as of this writing, is that the new repeater has arrived. We received it late February 8th. The engineering committee has some work to do in getting it installed, but with any kind of luck it will be operational by the time you read this in the SPARC GAP.

Our new machine is the Spectrum Communications model SCR-1000, serial number 0360. This is a modern, solid-state device. No more tubes to buy. It provides high and low power output adjusted to 60 and 30 watts, which may be switched by remote control. There are 5 remote control functions built in, each with 2 conditions, i.e. on or off. The receiver has a preselector providing about all the sensitivity we dare to use on a repeater with this much power and our 6-cavity duplexer. It has an 8-pole crystal filter providing all the selectivity we would ever want with an FM system using 5 KC deviation. When band crowding makes it necessary, we have a continuous tone squelch system which can be switched on.

Our built-in autopatch has a basic capability for reverse autopatch, but this feature is disabled by wiring changes, as we feel we would never want this. We have some engineering to do to get this patch to work with the cassette recorder we are planning to use for logging the autopatch. Our patch has circuitry which automatically refuses long-distance calls.

Next we want a circuit which will automatically inflict severe shock to anybody who grabs a microphone with intention of making deliberate interference. And just a small shocker for those of us who grab the wrong microphone to make a transmission and answer on the wrong frequency. Our station identifier and audio mixer circuits have a capability of making a warbling sound when properly triggered. Perhaps we should cause the machine to automatically "give the Bird" to those who hog the repeater too long.

Our congratulations and thanks go to WA4WOU, W4VIP and WA4AKH who are now qualified control operators and on the schedule. We are trying to re-shuffle the schedule to more evenly divide the load.

We recently issued a change sheet for the Control Operators Instruction Book giving a revised list of Control Operators and authorized remote control points.

I suppose all the mobiles are ready with their touch-tone pads. Let's don't wear out the autopatch the first month. If you find the autopatch inoperative, it may be because the logging recorder has run out of tape, and it will not work until some of the Engineering Committee who are authorized access to the repeater site can go and put on fresh tape.

NEWINGTON CT FEBRUARY 1, 1979 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

The ARRL Foundation Board of Directors met in Miami, Florida January 26, 1979. Satellites and Scholarships were the topics of the day as the Board heard a report from the Chairman of the Committee to Study Goals and Implementation of Goals. The consensus was that the Foundations efforts should be concentrated in the areas of satellites and scholarship funding. The Board voted to transfer to the Amateur Radio Satellite Corporation funds for AMSAT Phase III, including interest and dividends. The Board will also announce in April the two Long Island recipients of the Foundation administered scholarships. Payments of 300 dollars to the ARRL Museum Fund and 481 dollars to the WARC Preparation Fund were voted. The Foundation will study ways to publicize its goals, and will look into getting grants and contributions from other foundations.
