





He was in the 28th Division National Guard Band &, when inducted

into the Army during WWl, was sent to Fort Bragg, N.C., where he was in the 78th Division Military Band for a short while. He was then sent to a Field Artillery School, where he took advanced training. When sent overseas, he was severely injured & was discharged with 100% permanent & total service connected disability. After the discharge, he went to the VA Hospital in Pittsburgh & later was sent to Bay Pines, Florida.

Pete received his license in 1958, while a patient at the Bay Pines VA Center, with the call of KLRKY. For years he manned the radio station there, keeping schedules with other hospitals & passing traffic for the patients. He met Brian Felps & had the pleasure of starting him on the road to "Ham" radio to receive the call of KLNAN. Brian was just a kid, at that time, & took to cw quickly & has passed Pete along the way, as he has his Extra Class License.

Pete has many certificates, among them "Florida Skip; WAS; ARRL Public Service Award; Citations from the City of St. Petersburg & from Civil Defense for services during hurricane "Donna"; besides thousands of QSLs from all over the world.


He can be heard, from time to time, on 2-meters, but every day is on the International Handicappers Net, at 11 AM, 14287 kHz & asks



The Festival of States activities have just been completed. SPARC Repeater Feam had management responsibility as usual for safety communications for the Illuminated Night Parade preceded by fireworks April 3rd and the Day Parade April 7th. In addition, we furnished communications for the Youth Parade, a new function for us this year. Metro Repeater Ass'n took management for Champions on Parade and the Bicycle Race, I believe. Definite information not available at this time. With W4GPL assuming general responsibility and WA4TJG making personnel and/or station assignments, the SPARC participation was well-organized. Communication equipment, circuits and personnel worked almost to perfection. All of us can justly be proud of the way this went off.

As usual, the Parade Control Center was located in Bayfront Towers, First and Central, on the 28th floor. Personnel charged with management of each function were on hand -- Suncoasters, Red Cross, Doctors, Police/Fire/EMS. We operated 3 Amateur Radio circuits. K4SCL, operating on SPARC Repeater was NCS for the First Aid activity, under direction of Red Cross and Dr. Dean. K5IHH, on 146.49, was NCS for Parade Marshalls function under Ralph Spaulding. K4ISS was NCS on 223.66, managing Courtesy Cars under Bruce Haskell.

Our new repeater functioned beautifully through the entire operation. We even used the autopatch to good advantage on two occasions. Again I can point with pride to the state of the art in our equipment which permitted us to operate two stations in Bayfront Towers within 15 feet of each other, both on 2 meters, without mutual interference. In addition we had the 220 MHz circuit as well as portables on Police, Fire and Red Cross channels. Next year, if needed, we may have a circuit on 440 MHz for Wrecker Control.

FCC has assigned RM3314 to the petition filed by ARRL to allow Novices certain privileges on the 220 through 225 MHz band. Details of this petition will appear in March 1979 QST, page 58. In other action, FCC assigned RM3313 to the petition filed by ARRL proposing that standard FM emissions be allowed in the frequency range 52.0 through 52.5 MHz, thereby allowing the use of 16F3 emission in the entire six meter repeater subband AR

A proposed Amendment to the By-Laws, Re: pro-rating dues of new members, met with objections so it was referred to Board of Directors to bring in revised proposal. Final decision: \$4.00, Jan. 1 to July 1; \$2.00, July 1 to Oct. 1 & \$1.00, Oct. 1 to Dec.31,

all plus \$1.00 initiation fee.

It was quite a shock to learn WhRUR-Ed Blatt had joined the Silent Keys. Ed was crippled with arthritis, but sent beautiful code. He started code practice sessions, twice a week, in 1952 on 10-meters; later transmitting it similtaneously on 6, 10, & 40 meters. It was a great loss to amateur radio, as many owed obtaining their license to Ed. His YF-Martha (better known as Sweetie) had to help him with his radio, throwing switches, etc. at his directions. SPARC presented Ed with a plaque for his outstanding services in 1958 &, in 1965 he was winner of Florida Skip Amateur of the Year Award, receiving a \$50.00 Savings Bond.

Further trouble at SPARC: WB4DXB-Ralph, the newly elected Pres. was hospitalized for surgery, so V-Pres., John had to take over.

KLBRY-R.F. Wright, Jr., who sailed the briny seas wrote an interesting & informative article "Sailing, Sailing Over the Bounding Main", which ran in several issues of SPARC-GAP serially. Many other interesting articles by different members from time to time.

This was quite a year, again our meeting place at the FPC Linemen's Assembly Hall, was no longer available &, at the same time WB4DXB-Ralph had to resign, as it was necessary he & YF move to Sarasota. So W4ACG-John Smith took the reins as President. A new meeting place was procured at the AZalea Community Center, 9th Ave. & 72nd St. No.

SPARC Hamfest was held May 18th, at Lake Maggiore, with the usual crowd, lots of prizes & a huge success. We were honored to again have KlkQ-Chuck Bolvin, S.E. ARRL Director, attend & speak

to the group.

This year the Installation Dinner was held at Black Angus Restaurant, Jan. 9th, new Officers being: Pres., WhACG-John Smith; V-Pres., WB4JSI-Stan Hurst; Secty/Treas., W4TDK-Naomi Spence. 
