



The meeting of June 1, 1979 was called to order by Ed Harney K4DRN, Vice President. Members and guests were introduced and welcomed.

The Treasurer's Report was read and approved, and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Applications for car Amateur Radio license tags were made available during the meeting.

.A "thank you" letter from the winner of the first prize at our recent hamfest was read.

Dave K4KE told about his recent visit to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch near Live Oak. He attended the annual awards banquet where the graduating seniors are given recognition for their accomplishments. For the first time in many years, there were no awards for Rancher accomplishments in Amateur Radio.

Woody K4SCL said that the new repeater is presently at his home, but would be installed the following day at the site.

He also reported that 153 radio operators participated in the May 8th flood and tornado disaster operation.

Herb W4IRA gave the Florida Gulf Coast Council report. He said that our President WD4COL should return his Director's Badge at the earliest opportunity. Also, our club will purchase a block of banquet tickets (20) to sell. The banquet will be held on Saturday night of the Sand Key Hamfest. The Hamfest will be held on November 17-18,1979. 

SPARC REPEATER NEWS

Following our meeting of May 18th, SPARC Repeater Team hosted a critique of the disaster communications in connection with the tornadoes and floods of May 8th. Present were Lt. Danny Mink, Sheriff's Communication Center, Terry O'Hearn, Civil Defense RACES Officer, John Komp, American Red Cross and Woody Huddleston for City of St. Petersburg. All Amateur Radio groups were represented. Sheriff and Red Cross especially praised Radio Amateurs for excellent performance during the disaster. Civil Defense and City of St. Pete did not have any significant Amateur Radio involvement. Lt. Mink invited us to hold our next meeting at Sheriff's Offices so he could arrange for conducted tours through his Communication Center and 911 Emergency Telephone Center. This meeting is scheduled for June 15th.

On May 24th Sheriff's Dept. suffered a lightning stroke which disabled 2 of their 3 repeaters. Amateur Radio operators of the Pinellas County A.R.E.S., responding to Lt. Mink's call for help, established a network of 52 stations within 30 minutes covering Pinellas County. This was done in spite of our own difficulties with another lightning strike taking out the power supply on the 37/97 repeater necessitating shift of operations to 66/06. Very little traffic was handled, but apparently Sheriff's Dept. was pleased with our response.

Also on May 24th, a meeting of Assistant E.C.s was held at the home of K4SCL, ARRL Emergency Coordinator, Pinellas County. This was attended by W4GPL WA4MJT W4DPH WA4CZW WA4FYR WA4ESX WD4COL WA4TGQ and WA4KNI. A frequency utilization plan for disasters was presented by WA4ESX and approved by the group. Basically, this involves using specific frequencies for specific kinds of traffic or emergencies as follows: 1. SPARC 66/06 Red Cross, Shelters, County-wide coordination and miscellaneous; 2. METRO 96/36 Fire Departments, Rescue and Ambulance; 3. TBRA Largo 37/97 Sheriff; C.D. and Police; 4. CARS 223.34/224.94 Hospitals; 5. Ten Meters 28,720 Liaison and Coordination as feasible. Of course the Section-wide emergency frequencies 3940, 7247 and 7272 KHz will be used as necessary. This plan envisions any intense local activity, not county-wide in nature, will be on simplex and ARES members are urged to have following simplex frequencies available: 146.49, 147.51, 146.85, 223.66.

W4GPL completed a survey of last year's Radio Amateur Callbook and found 1318 Amateurs listed in Pinellas County. We are now saying there are approximately 1500 in the County.

On June 5th, Morton Plant hospital suffered a telephone system failure and Radio Amateurs responded, first arrival being in 10 minutes, establishing communications between key points internally as well as external to the hospital. Star performers on this were W4DPH WB4FVN WA4MJT WA4KKR WA4FYR WB4PEL KA4BBB WB4AIZ. Additional standby and liaison were K4TH WA4TJG WA4KNI W4GPL WA4CZW WA4QHE N4AKN W5ROF WB4LXH K4SCL W4IRA and W4VIP. This lasted 1 hours until telephone was repaired. Amateur Radio got some good publicity out of this with items in Clearwater Sun and St. Petersburg Times.

SPARC REPEATER NEWS cont'd.

SPARC's "new" Spectrum repeater was placed in service again on June 2nd with autopatch and all control functions operational. It has been going OK for a week, so maybe we have the worst bugs out of it now. Our sincere thanks to W4GPL, K5IHH and K4NAN who worked diligently with me on this last round of repairs.

We have had several cases of interference. One is apparently a spur, possibly from a local FM station, centering about 147.04 but with components getting into our receiver on 147.66 and keying up the repeater almost continuously. This has been mostly eliminated by tightenning the squelch. Another case was an unlicensed station identified as W2140 operating briefly on the repeater. He was possibly using stolen equipment saying he bought it for \$5. Metro personnel, K4RHD WA4KNI and WA4FYR mounted a direction-finder search for this station but he went off the air before they found him. You may be interested in looking up the item in a recent QST where another "V" station in Largo was apprehended by FCC, fined, CB license revoked and Amateur Radio license denied.

During the May 8th disaster operations we had a station, identified as WA9CLA, operating on our repeater helping with the emergency. It was later learned he was unlicensed and he has been silenced by the FCC Tampa.

On June 7th we had a case of a base station with carrier inadvertently keyed on timing out the repeater for about an hour. A D/F search was initiated with WA4KNI WA4FYR WB4YCQ and K4RHD involved. WB4YCQ found the transmitter and turned it off, the owner not being home. Apparently it was a case of a young child playing radio when his dad was not present.


