





OFFICIAL BULLETIN NR 743 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS
NEWINGTON CT JANUARY 26, 1979 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

THE ARRL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MET IN MIAMI, FLORIDA, JANUARY 24 AND 25, 1979. CONTINUING PREPARATIONS FOR THIS YEAR'S WORLD ADMINISTRATIVE RADIO CONFERENCE AND PLANNING FOR THE YEARS AFTER WARC WERE GIVEN. EXTENDED ATTENTION BY THE BOARD. RECOGNIZING THE HEAVY FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS ALREADY MADE TO THE WARC EFFORT AND THE NEED FOR A SOLID FINANCIAL BASE ON WHICH TO BUILD FOR THE FUTURE OF AMATEUR RADIO, THE BOARD VOTED AN INCREASE IN MEMBERSHIP DUES. EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 1979, DUES WILL BE PAYABLE AT THE RATE OF EIGHTEEN DOLLARS PER YEAR WITH ADDITIONAL POSTAGE SURCHARGES FOR CANADIAN AND FOREIGN MEMBERS. BEFORE APRIL 1, MEMBERS MAY PAY AT PRESENT RATES FOR UP TO FIVE YEARS IN ADVANCE. AFTER A REVIEW OF U.S. WARC PROPOSALS AS THEY NOW STAND, THE BOARD EXPRESSED STRONG SUPPORT FOR RETENTION OF A MORSE CODE REQUIREMENT FOR AN AMATEUR LICENSE AND FOR RETENTION OF THE 220 MHZ BAND WITHOUT UNFAVORABLE SHARING ARRANGEMENTS. THE BOARD ALSO EXPRESSED DEEP APPRECIATION FOR THE WARC ASSISTANCE BEING PROVIDED BY MANY AMATEURS WITHOUT FANFARE OR PUBLICITY. LOOKING TO THE FUTURE, THE PRESIDENT OF ARRL WILL ESTABLISH A LONG-RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN EXTENSIVE STUDY OF FUTURE PROGRAMS. AN ARRL INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL IS BEING FORMED TO PROVIDE EXPERTISE FROM BUSINESS, GOVERNMENT AND OTHER FIELDS. IN OTHER ACTIONS, THE BOARD ADOPTED REVISED CRITERIA FOR THE DXCC COUNTRIES LIST AS RECOMMENDED BY THE DX ADVISORY COMMITTEE. COUNTRIES NOW ON THE LIST WILL NOT BE AFFECTED. THE DX AWARDS PROGRAM WILL BE REVIEWED WITH THE OBJECTIVE OF MAINTAINING THE PRESENT LEVEL OF SERVICES. THE TECHNICAL EXCELLENCE AWARD FOR 1977 GOES TO WAYNE OVERBECK, N6NB FOR HIS QST ARTICLE ON THE QUAGI ANTENNA. MEMBERS WILL BE ENCOURAGED TO CONTRIBUTE ARTICLES TO THEIR JOURNAL, QST. DIRECTORS ANDERSON, ARNOLD, EGBERT AND PRICE WERE ELECTED TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND PAST DIRECTOR J.A. DOC GMELIN, W6ZRJ WAS ELECTED AN HONORARY VICE PRESIDENT IN RECOGNITION OF MANY YEARS OF VOLUNTEER SERVICE TO AMATEUR RADIO. STUDIES WERE ORDERED IN MANY AREAS INCLUDING THE FOLLOWING -- SPECIAL PROBLEMS IN THE CANADIAN DIVISION, WAYS TO ENCOURAGE GREATER MEMBERSHIP PARTICIPATION IN ARRL, FASTER WAYS TO DISTRIBUTE SOUND RECORDINGS OF QST TO THE BLIND, THE STRUCTURE OF THE VHF REPEATER AND VHF/UHF ADVISORY COMMITTEES AND AN AWARD TO HONOR VHF PIONEER SAM HARRIS, WIFZJ. DETAILED MINUTES AND A FULL REPORT ON THE BOARD MEETING WILL APPEAR IN MARCH QST AR

SPARC REPEATER NEWS

The SPARC Repeater has been doing OK. No down time. A lightning strike took out a switch and killed the A.C., but the machine continued to operate on battery. We made temporary repairs wiring around the switch. The switch still needs to be fixed. We have the Spectrum pre-amplifier for the receiver back from the factory. It still needs to be installed and our pre-amplifier with the monolithic filter needs power supply modified cations so it will operate on either battery or A.C. Our tone decoders appear to lack sensitivity, so that some Control Operators have trouble making the machine respond to control codes. A few people (very few) still have trouble accessing the autopatch. We tried to increase the decoder sensitivity, but to no avail. We now suspect a bad potentiometer, but have not had time to change it.

K5IHH has completed his A.C. power detector and installed it. It has capability of performing several functions when A.C. power fails. One function in use now is to disable the autopatch when power fails, as autopatch recorder runs on A.C. only. We plan to have Bob's device change the tone on the I.D. so as to warn us when the A.C. has failed. Other schemes are possible, such as switching to a different program on the I.D. so as to spell out more clearly the condition prevailing.

The Tone Access system on the repeater is now fully ready for operation and may be turned on remotely by the Control Operator or Trustee at any time. While it is on, only those stations which transmit a continuous "sub-audible" tone of proper frequency and deviation will be able to access the machine. With this system on, the machine is considered to be in "Automatic Control" and a Control Operator is not required to be on duty. Before switching to automatic control, control operator must ensure that autopatch is disabled. We are not allowed to use autopatch without a control operator on duty.

Much emphasis is on emergency communication preparedness these days. With permission of KI4T, Editor, we quote from South Florida FM Association, Inc. "Emergency Communication Guide."

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION KIT. This kit should be kept ready at all times. It is primarily a VHF kit, but provides for HF antenna materials as well. IDENTIFICATION: (1) Photocopy of ham license. (2) ARES/RACES ID cards & Patches. (3) ID tag with name & call. (4) Municipal ID. PAPER GOODS: (1) Notepads. (2) ARRI/C.D. message pads. (3) Log. (4) ARPSC Manual & THIS booklet. (5) Pencils. (6) Check list of items in kit. HARDWARE: (1) 100 yd. roll of 100 lb. test monofilament. (2) Fused power cord for rig with battery clips. (3) Extra fuses. (4) Assorted connectors (3 barrel, 1 double male, 1 right angle, 1 TT, 1 PL259, 1 SO239 chassis type, 1 Male RCA to SO239 adapter, 1 male to female phone plug for earphones). (5) Extra battery clips. (6) 2 12-15' lengths of RG58U or mini-8 with PL259s at both ends. (7) Travel-tenna or other portable 2 meter antenna.



It was with pleasure that I noted WB4FVN carries her own emergency kit with her at all times. When trouble struck the Morton Plant Hospital June 5th, this enabled her to be at the scene of trouble and operational within IO minutes. Now you have to be proud of any of our people who prove themselves in that manner. The promptness with which K4TH, WA4TGQ and others responded to the Sheriff's emergency on May 24th also attest to our readiness.




