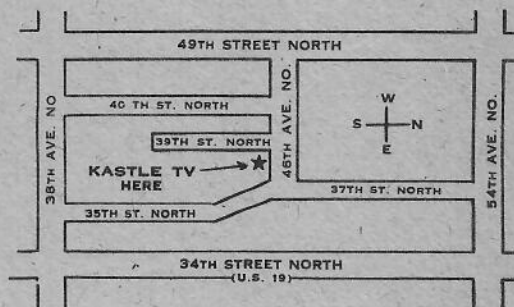

OUR NEXT MEETING WILL BE HELD ON DECEMBER 7, 1979 AT 8:00 P.M. AT RED
CROSS HEADQUARTERS 818 4th Street North, St. Petersburg, FL

The meeting of November 2nd was called to order by the Secretary,
and immediately called for nominations for a Chairman Protem to preside
over the meeting in the absence of the President and Vice President.
Rex W4GPL was nominated.

Visitors and members were introduced and welcomed.

Dave K4KE told about the Annual Open House and Horse Show at the
Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch that was held recently. Dave said that
several of the area amateurs were there and two stations were set up:
one at the Ham Shack, located in the Activities Building at the Ranch,
and one at the horse arena. Traffic was handled on the Ranch repeater,
146.34/94 and quite a bit of interest was shown. Friday evening every-
one enjoyed the chicken and rice dinner; Saturday the radio stations
were set up, traffic was passed over the repeater as well as sent out
on cw, and a delicious lunch of bar-b-cue beef was served. Saturday
evening the annual "mini hamfest" was held in Lake City where the hams
who participated during the day at the Ranch got together for dinner
and conversation. K4KE has been very active at the Florida Sheriffs
Boys Ranch over the years, and has been responsible for many Ranchers
and Staff members to become licensed radio operators.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Thanks
was given to Wes WD4PUV for the fine job he did in the absence of the
secretary.

The Treasurer's Report was read and approved.

John W4ACG gave the station report. He thanked everyone who worked
so hard at the Red Cross installing the new Wilson beam, coax, 220 an-
tenna, as well as the new antenna purchased by the Red Cross for their
communications. New guy wires still need to be installed on all the
antennas in the very near future. John especially recognized the help
of Wes WD4PUV, Oliver WD4KGY, and Rex W4GPL, however, there were several
more who put in much time and effort during the weekend of work.

Woody K4SCL gave the Repeater Report. He asked if anyone had no-
ticed that the ID had been changed. WR4ALM license expires in November,
so the Trustee's call was programed in the Repeater while work was being
done on it. A new crystal and two pre-amps were installed. The auto-
patch had to be disabled until someone can go to the site and fix it.
The Repeater Team has purchased a 220 MHz radio and placed it in the
station at Red Cross Headquarters. The radio will be in control of the
repeater team to be used where it is needed.

Mike N4AUO gave the Net report. He said that he needed a net
control on Wednesday and Saturday evenings, and will need a new Net
Manager in three weeks. Mike has done a fine job as net Manager, and
the membership is sorry to have him leave this position.

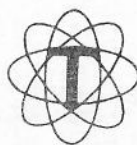

SPARC REPEATER NEWS

The Team has purchased a first rate 220 MHz station, a Midland 13-513, synthesized for all available frequencies, up to 20 watts, and complete with power supply, coax and antenna. We have placed it at the W4GAC Club Station for use of members. This station should relieve some of the traffic load on the SPARC Repeater during emergencies, and improve our flexibility in general.

We are now using tone access (CTCSS) from 11 P.M. to 6 A.M. This, in effect, eliminates the "Quiet Hours" which we have had in effect for five years. Any member having the proper CTCSS may use the machine at will during these hours. It behooves all members to report any improper practices observed and if such practices are not corrected we will have to adopt other procedures or shut the machine down.

Control operator procedures are as follows: A. At 11 P.M.: 1. Inhibit autopatch. 2. Test to see that it is inhibited. 3. Switch PL ON. 4. Test to see that it is on. 5. Make log entry: "Autopatch inhibited, PL On, repeater on automatic control, going off duty without relief." B. At 6 A.M.: 1. Turn PL OFF. Test Carrier Access. Note: It may sometimes be necessary also to turn TX On, i.e. carrier access on. 2. Turn Autopatch ON (i.e. uninhibit), test and annotate tape. 3. Make log entry: "Assumed control of K4SCL/RPT. Turned PL Off and Autopatch On. System tests OK." Telephone should be used for control signals where possible, but some things have to be done over the air, like testing autopatch and annotating tape. All control signals may be sent over the air when telephone does not work.

On October 26 the Spectrum machine was in the shop for extensive maintenance work which we had planned for several months. K5IHH, K4NAN and K4SCL spent 8 to 10 hours each and completed most of the projects we had on our list. I am sure everybody has noticed the change in I.D. to "K4SCL/RPT". Our WR4AIM license expires this month. You may also notice slightly better receiver sensitivity, as well as a slight increase in intermod. The two seem to go hand-in-hand. We made repairs to the autopatch board, expecting to have improved autopatch and telephone control performance, but the SCAP board had another failure within 24 hours, so the patch is off the air until we can repair it and telephone control is worse than ever. Too bad this design does not permit patch and control functions to be separated completely.

One of our maintenance projects that did not turn out well was installation of the "stripper" to take the CTCSS tone out of the repeated audio. It stripped OK, but introduced unacceptable noise. I believe we can do better on our next try, but we were running short of time. Also, we were unable to use the new International Crystal in the transmitter for lack of a good silver mica fixed capacitor of the right value. Again, we should do better next time.

With expiration of our WR4AIM license, we need to change our By-Laws to delete reference to same. Also we need more flexibility in determining Repeater dues. We are embarrassed at the moment by having too much money in our treasury, so we plan to propose changes to By-Law at the Annual Meeting to correct these problems.

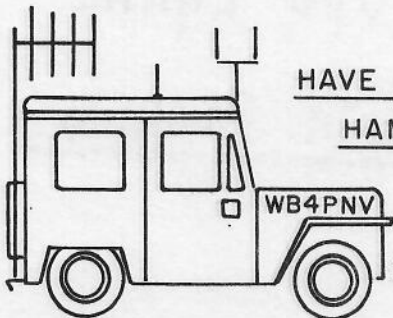

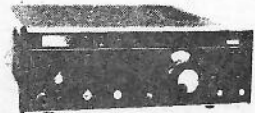

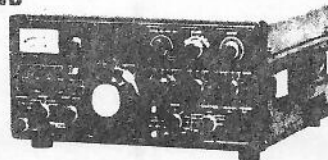

ARRL BULLETIN NR 100 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS
NEWINGTON CT SEPTEMBER 27, 1979 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS B7

On September 27, 1979, the Federal Communications Commission turned down point of sale control for Amateur equipment because of the difficulty of enforcement, and because of the questionable legality of such control. On another item, the Commission has formally changed the rules to now require an Amateur to use form 610 to change his mailing address, and licenses submitted for modification will automatically be renewed for five years. The item concerning the use of 8 level ASCII language in Amateur Radio was deleted from the agenda at the last moment, at the request of Commissioner Brown. Details will appear in QST AR

Naomi could not attend. Pres., WA4FNY-Bill announced K4FCW-Jim Keyes was researching obtaining liability insurance for the Club & a special meeting would be held at the March meeting to deal with proposed By-Laws. He appointed WB4ARZ-Kim Cole, Station Manager; K4NE-Lew Sieck, Florida Skip writer; WA4FPS-Bill Childs, Public Relations & K4JBL-Stan Kahn, Hamfest Chairman. The Club voted to join Florida Gulf Coast Council. Disaster Communication Committee appointed were: WA4FYR-Paul; WB4YTY-John & W4EXS-Art.

K4SCL-Woody reported Repeater Station-WR4ALM emergency stand-by frequency is 146.49 MHz simplex. Plans for Annual Hamfest shaping up.

Pres., WA4FNY-Bill suffered back & neck injuries, with dislocation of several vertebrae, as a result of auto accident & was hospitalized for a week, due to partial paralysis on left side.

The Special Meeting for disposition of proposed By-Law changes was held & was passed.

WR4ALM was moved to 1301 - 34th St. No., with antenna 210 feet above ground level, atop the Times Publishing Co. tower & switched Repeater Team meeting to Red Cross rather than Fire Department Headquarters, previous place

In May, the members were saddened by report that K4KKK-Jim Clark joined the Silent Keys. Jim was a long time member of the Club; assisted at Hamfests, giving the kids lolly pops, etc. & though 92 years young, continued to do most of the antenna work, climbing towers, etc. He will be greatly missed in more ways than one.

K4TH-George agreed to be the Director, representing SPARC at the Florida Gulf Coast Radio Council meetings.

At the October meeting, changes recommended by By-Law Committee were presented. As there was some controversy about the changes, the Executive Committee was called into session October 14th, to study the matter, so that an alternate plan was submitted. Unfortunately there were those in SPARC very much against progress; that is, addition of 2-meter FM & the Repeater Team, so there were some "stormy times" before a satisfactory settlement could be made.

The SPARC Repeater Team is indeed an asset to the Club. It has brought increased membership; more Public Service activities such as; Communications for "Toys for Tots Telethon"; Festival State Parades; Golf Tournaments; "Around the Island" canoe race; Yacht Races; besides their 24-hour monitoring of WR4ALM & rendering assistance in all kind of instances. There is the SPARC Net every night at 6:30 PM on 147.66/06 & SPARC-GAP has grown to 7 pages, with increased revenue from additional advertising. All this not for one year but every year.

Pres., WA4FNY-Bill called special meeting Dec. 3rd, purpose of voting on By-Laws & election of officers. Ballots were put in envelopes, call letters on same & turned over to the Executive Committee to verify & tabulate. The proposed changes to the By-Laws were defeated, so dues & organization remained unchanged.

On Dec. 5th, SPARC Repeater Team, in cooperation with Tampa Bay Optimist Clubs, participated in "Toys for Tots Telethon". WA4FNY-Bill appeared on Channel 10 TV, with representatives of other Clubs, to help tell the public about Amateur Radio involvement. WB4HYH-Leon was coordinator of SPARC effort, with WA4ORX dispatching from their camper-truck parked at the TV studio. W4GPL & WA4FPS assisted at the studio.

December 9th meeting, WA4FNY-Bill advised K5THH/4-Bob Browning the Executive Committee had made him Honorary Lifetime member of SPARC.

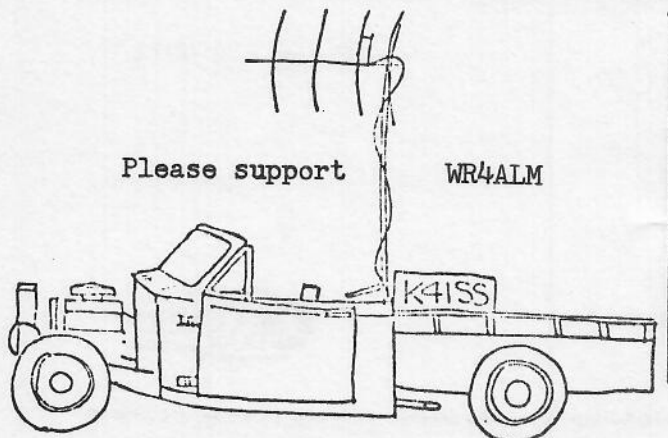

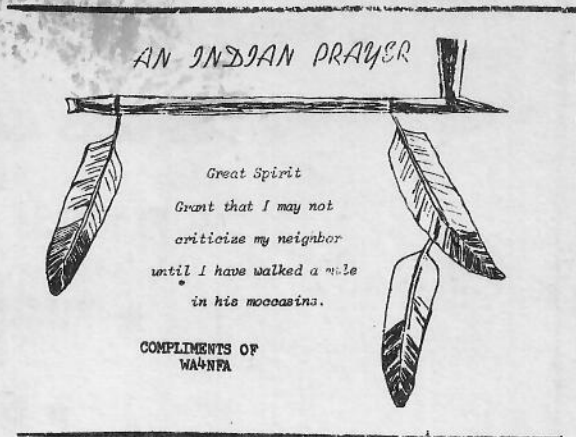
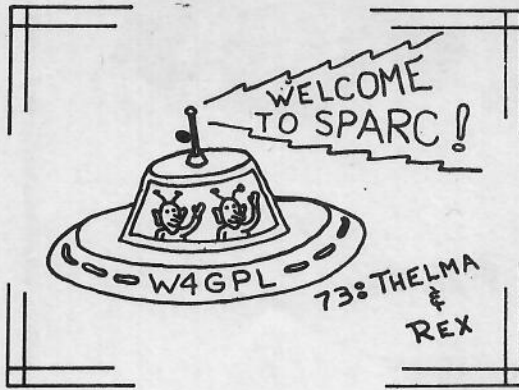
